INTRODUCTION

Ring those Bethlehem Bells is a program designed for preschool and kindergarten age children to present to the church or simply a small group of families and friends. The approximate running time is about 30 minutes. This program may include more material than you wish to use. Please make adjustments and changes to fit the material to your schedule and situation.

The theme of this program is Christmas bells. Throughout the telling of the Christmas story, children present poems, songs, and even handbell songs. There are also a few songs chosen for the assembly. Sheet music for many of the songs is included. Those not included can be easily located.

THE BELLS

Since the theme is centered around bells, it would be best if each child had his or her own set of bells. Instructions are included for simple wrist bells that your children can make.

There are two songs included that can be played with an octave set of 8 children's handbells or handchimes. These songs are optional. You can still easily perform a wonderful program without the use of these two songs.

GIFT ITEM

Ring These Bethlehem Bells

Children gather in another room.

Teacher: Thank you for joining us today. We've been anxiously waiting for the opportunity to share our Christmas message with you. Maybe we could say to **ring out** our Christmas message to you, since our program is all about bells.

Bells are important to us at Christmastime. We love to hear the church bells calling out to the community that we are about to gather to worship the Savior. We enjoy songs like *The Carol of the Bells* and *I Heard the Bells on Christmas Day*. Some of us may decorate our trees with bell shaped ornaments, or maybe we even hang special bells on our front doors.

Our children enjoy the sounds that bells make and they are eager to ring out the message that Jesus is born.

CHILDREN ENTER (Give each child a bell to ring as they file into the room one by one.)

△ Child One: (ringing bell) *One bell ringer, walking through town, ringing his (her) bell, up and down.* (Child one keeps ringing bell as child two enters room.)

△ Child Two: (ringing bell) *Two bell ringers, walking through town, ringing their bells, up and down.* (Both children keep ringing as third child enters room.)

△ Child Three: (and so on until all children are in room ringing their bells.) *Three bell ringers* . . . (Stop ringing)



PART ONE: We First See a Man and a Lady

Children Say: First we all see that a man and a lady

Ride o'er the hills and the dells,

They've come a long way so that they could be counted,

In our story of Bethlehem bells.

Teacher: "In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world. (This was the first census that took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria.) And everyone went to his own town to register" (Luke 2:1-3).

© Children Ring and Sing: O Come, Little Children (You may have adults join in singing)

O come, little children, O come one and all,

To Bethlehem haste, to the manger so small,

God's son for a gift has been sent you this night

To be your redeemer, your joy and delight.

He's born in a stable for you and for me, Draw near by the bright gleaming starlight to see, In swaddling clothes lying so meek and so mild, And purer than angels the heavenly Child.

See Mary and Joseph, with love beaming eyes, Are gazing upon the rude bed where He lies, The shepherds are kneeling, with hearts full of love While angels sing loud hallelujahs above.

(Children sing verse two)

Children Show: Five Little Bells

We love to hear you ringing.

(Finger play)

(Hold up one closed fist)

Five little bells, hanging in a row,

(Hold up one finger & wave it back and forth)

The first one said, "Ring me slow."

(Hold up two fingers & quickly wave them back & forth) The second one said, "Ring me fast."

(Hold up three fingers and ring back and forth) The third one said, "Ring me last."

(Hold out four fingers, but this time point them to the floor and ring them back & forth) The fourth one said, "I'm like a chime."

(Children hold up all five fingers & wave to the audience as they exit) The fifth one said, "Ring us all at Christmastime!"
